## 2021 Delray Beach Open

The Delray Beach Open by VITACOST.com, an ATP Tour 250 tournament, returns for its 29th year.

### Date Change

With the Australian Open moving to February and the normal dates for this tournament, the Delray Beach Open moved ahead to this season-opening time slot. While it is the earliest week for the tournament, it marks the fourth time it has started in January (also 2005-07), though it was completed in February in each of those previous years.

### What Else is New?

In addition to the date, there are a few other changes this year. It is a 28-player draw this year, down from 32, which means the top four seeds have byes into the second round. On court, there are no line judges rather an electronic line calling system is being utilized.

### Nice to Meet You

This is also a new experience for a number of players with 12 entrants playing the Delray Beach Open for the first time (not including qualifiers).

### International Flavor

Thirteen different countries are represented in the main draw singles field at this year's Delray Beach Open. Including the doubles, qualifying and Champions Tour players, there are a total of 30 nations are represented.

### Country Connection

Koreans **Soonwoo Kwon** and **Ji Sung Nam** are both in the singles, marking the second time at an ATP Tour event two Koreans are in the same field. It previously occurred at the 2008 Beijing tournament. In addition, a pair of Koreans have been in the main draw at two Grand Slam events.

### Age Range

There is a 21-year gap in age between the oldest (41-year-old **Ivo Karlovic**) and youngest (20-year-old **Sebastian Korda**) players in the singles field. Karlovic is one of seven 30+ players in the field. Korda is one of eight players aged 24 or younger competing this week.

### Familiar Faces

Two players in the year's draw are adding to their double-digit tally of appearances in Delray Beach. **Ivo Karlovic** is making his 12th appearance, tying him with Xavier Malisse for second all-time between Vince Spadea who played here 13 times. **Sam Querrey** will be making his 11th appearance at the Delray Beach Open.

### First Timers

Nine players who have won their maiden ATP title in Delray Beach, the most recent being Radu Albot in 2019. Thirteen players in the field are seeking their first ATP Tour title (not including qualifiers)

### American Accolades

Four of the past five champions here have been American - Reilly Opelka (2020), **Frances Tiafoe** (2018), Jack Sock (2017) and **Sam Querrey** (2016). An American has won the Delray Beach Open title eight times in 28 years.

### Top Billing

Chile's **Cristian Garin** is the top seed, marking the third time in his career he has been No. 1 at a tournament (also Santiago in 2020 and Bastad in 2019). He is the second South American to be top seed in Delray Beach (Juan Martin del Potro in 2019). The No. 1 seed has won this tournament only once - Mardy Fish in 2009. Garin has won a pair of ATP titles in each of the past two seasons.

### Title Talk

Three former champions are in this year's field - **Frances Tiafoe** (2018), **Sam Querrey** (2016) and **Ivo Karlovic** (2015). Only four players have won this title twice - Ernests Gulbis (2010, '13), Xavier Malisse (2005, '07), Jan-Michael Gambill (2001, '03) and Jason Stoltenberg (1996-97).

### Aces All Around

The top two career ace hitters on the ATP Tour and three of the top five will be in action this week. **Ivo Karlovic** is the all-time leader with 13,619 aces while **John Isner** is second at 12,365. **Sam Querrey** is fifth all-time with 8,325 aces in his career.

### Movement Memo

In an effort to reduce crowding in entrances to the stadium, patrons will be allowed to enter and exit on even games as well as during changeovers in the lower seating bowl. In addition, free movement will be allowed in the upper seating areas.

### Health & Safety

A number of measures have been put in place to ensure the health and safety of everyone involved with the tournament. Those measures include requirements for masks, using only 2,000 distant seats in the 8,000 seat stadium and removing touchpoints from the venue. 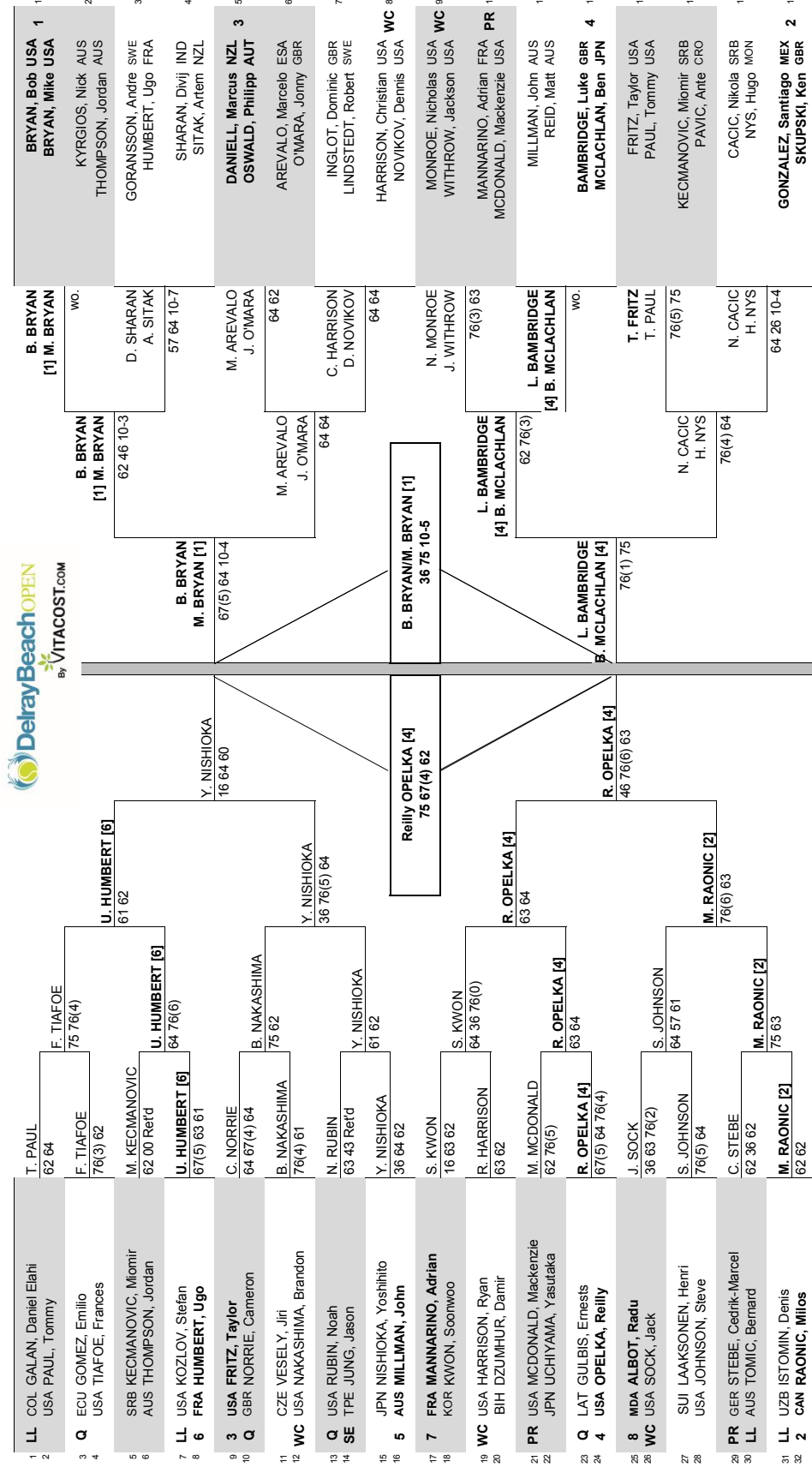

### 2021 ATP Champions Tour Player Bios

#### BOB & MIKE BRYAN (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: First ATP Champions Tour appearance. Six-time doubles champions of ATP 250 event, including the last two years, They had a 30-7 record in the ATP Tour tournament, reaching the final eight times. The 2020 title came in their final ATP Tour tournament. CAREER: The winningest team in the history of the sport with 119 titles, including 16 Major titles. They are the only doubles or singles players to sweep all four Grand Slams, nine ATP Masters 1000 events, the ATP Finals and Olympics winning gold in London (2012) and bronze in Beijing (2008). The Bryan Brothers also have the most victories by any doubles team in U.S. Davis Cup history with a 24-5 record including winning the Davis Cup in 2007. They finished No. 1 in team rankings 10 times during their career.

#### LUKE & MURPHY JENSEN (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: First ATP Champions Tour appearance. Played ATP Tour event eight times, with best success coming when tournament was in Coral Springs with a final in 1997 and semifinal in 1996. CAREER: Together won four titles including the 1993 French Open. That season they finished as the No. 5 duo on the ATP Tour. The duo also finished as runner-up on seven occasions. Luke overall won an additional six titles with four other partners.

#### WAYNE FERREIRA (SOUTH AFRICA)

DELRAY BEACH: Making his third ATP Champions Tour appearance. CAREER: Won 15 career singles titles including two ATP Masters 1000s. Finalist on eight other occasions. He played a then-record 56 consecutive Grand Slam tournaments, reaching a pair of Australian Open semifinals. In 1995-96, he became first player from South Africa to complete back-to-back Top 10 seasons. In doubles, he won 11 titles. In addition, he won first Olympic medal for South Africa in 32 years with a doubles silver at the 1992 Barcelona games. As a junior, he was No. 1 ranked doubles player and won 1998 US Open.

#### ROBBY GINEPRI (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: Making ATP Champions Tour debut. Including qualifying, played ATP 250 tournament five times, with best result being a run to the semifinals in 2008. CAREER: Winner of three ATP titles, all in the US. Career-best season came in 2005 when he reached quarterfinals or better in seven tournaments and finished with a career high 37 match wins. That year he also reached the US Open semifinals, winning three straight five-set matches before falling to Andre Agassi in five. Reached US Open junior final in 2000, losing to Andy Roddick.

#### TOMMY HAAS (GERMANY)

DELRAY BEACH: Making third ATP Champions Tour appearance, he is a two-time defending champion in the event. During ATP 250 career, posted 11-8 record, winning 2006 title in his debut. CAREER: Spent eight years in the Top 20 of ATP rankings, reaching a career high of No. 2 in 2002. Won 15 titles in his career, including winning eight consecutive finals from 2004-12. Overall, contested 28 finals, including finishing with the silver medal at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. A three-time semifinalist at the Australian Open, he also reached one Wimbledon semifinal.

Over the course of his career, he defeated Andre Agassi, Novak Djokovic, Roger Federer and Pete Sampras at least three times each. The 2004 and 2012 ATP Comeback Player of the Year, he underwent nine surgeries during his career.

#### JOHAN KRIEK (SOUTH AFRICA)

DELRAY BEACH: Making his fourth appearance in the Delray Beach ATP Champions Tour event. CAREER: Reached the quarterfinals or better in all four Grand Slams, winning Australian Open titles in '81 & '82. Won 14 career singles titles and 8 doubles titles, reaching an all-time high ranking of No. 7 in singles and No. 12 in doubles. From '93-'00 Kriek played on the ATP Champions Tour with Connors, Borg, McEnroe and others, reaching the No. 1 senior tour world ranking in both singles and doubles. Kriek and his doubles partner Kevin Curren won the Wimbledon Senior Doubles title 4 times in a row from '03-'06.

#### JESSE LEVINE (CANADA)

DELRAY BEACH: Playing the ATP Champions Tour here for the fourth time, he also played the ATP Tour tournament on four occasions. CAREER: Won 5 career Challenger titles in 8 finals. Reached a career-high ranking of No. 69 in 2012. Reached the Houston doubles final in '09. Born a Canadian, the lefty represented the US from 2007-12 before becoming eligible to play for Canada in 2013 on the Davis Cup team. Put together a 24-1 freshman record All-American season ('06-'07) at the University of Florida where he was named National Rookie of the Year. Was 21-0 in regular season dual matches and reached the NCAA quarterfinals. In the juniors, won the 2001 USTA Clay Court 14 Nationals singles title, the boys' 16s doubles title and the 2005 Junior Wimbledon doubles title. Reached the Jr. Wimbledon singles quarterfinals in 2005.

#### MARK MERKLEIN (BAHAMAS)

DELRAY BEACH: Making ATP Champions Tour debut in Delray Beach. One-time singles competitor in ATP Tour event, played doubles seven times. Reached 1998 final (with Vince Spadea) and 2004 semifinals (with Xavier Malisse). CAREER: Winner of four career ATP titles from seven finals. Quarterfinalist at 2000 Sydney Olympics (with Mark Knowles). A two-time NCAA champion for the University of Florida, winning the doubles title in 1993 followed by singles in 1994.

#### MIKAEL PERNFORS (SWEDEN)

DELRAY BEACH: Making sixth ATP Champions Tour appearance. Played ATP Tour event once, in its opening year at Coral Springs in 1993. CAREER: On ATP Tour, won 3 singles titles, had a career high ranking of No. 10 and reached the quarterfinals of the 1990 Australian Open and the finals of Roland Garros in 1986 defeating Stefan Edberg and Boris Becker on the way. Prior to turning pro, Pernfors won back-to-back NCAA singles titles (1984-85) while at the University of Georgia and also led his team to the NCAA title in 1985.
